Dear Judge Pendergast,

Pursuant to Penal Code §933.05, as the Secretary to the Board of Education for the Fairfield-Suisun Unified School District, I am providing the following response to the 2025-26 Grand Jury Report titled Continuation Schools in Solano County, released May 22, 2026, on the Board's behalf.

Finding 2: The 2024-25 SARC for Sem Yeto High School shows a 1:24 teacher to student ratio; staff at Sem Yeto report having little time to spend with individual students due to large class sizes, which negatively impacts student-teacher time.

The District agrees with the finding.

Recommendation 2: The Fairfield-Suisun Unified School District hire additional teaching staff to ensure Sem Yeto High School maintains a 1:20 teacher to student ratio in line with CDE recommendations by July 2027.

The recommendation to hire additional staff will not be implemented because it is not warranted. Without hiring additional staff, Sem Yeto at Armijo maintained a 1:13 teacher to student ratio, and Sem Yeto at Fairfield maintained a 1:17.2 ratio during the spring 2026 semester. While the District strives to maintain 1:20 ratios throughout the year, it is not always possible. Schedules are created based on the academic needs of the individual students and are adjusted every nine weeks.
