Ms. Proctor has a superb legal mind and a long history of excellence in her practice as an Alternate Public Defender in Solano County.”

Ms. Proctor is currently an attorney with the Solano County Alternate Public Defender’s Office where she handles a high-volume felony caseload representing indigent criminal defendants. Prior to her work at the Alternative Defender’s Office, Ms. Proctor worked as a staff attorney at the Dependency Advocacy Center in San Jose, representing indigent parents in juvenile dependency proceedings. She has also served as a Certified Law Clerk for the San Francisco Public Defender’s Office and the Marin County Public Defender’s Office.

Ms. Proctor earned a Bachelor of Science in Mathematics at the University of California at Irvine and her Juris Doctorate from the University of California College of Law in San Francisco.
